Your Neighbourhood Policing Team have spent the summer months ensuring that everyone enjoys the summer holidays without disturbance. Working with our partners we had a Fun Day at Ridgewood Park, Pensby that was well attended and lived up to its name. Along with the Hope Centre we arranged for Rampworx to visit the skateboard park in Heswall, which was a very popular day. We also took a group of young people on a trip to learn about safety skills.



The diversionary activities and our active presence in the parks and open spaces appears to have had an effect as reported incidents of anti social behaviour are significantly down in July and August, continuing the year-on-year downward trend.

As the schools return shortly I would like to remind parents to park considerately and in compliance with road markings, even when only parking for a short time. Please be thoughtful as this is a safety issue.

### Arrests, charges and convictions

On 17<sup>th</sup> August four people from Liverpool were arrested for burglary at a shop on Telegraph Road, Heswall. The 2 men and 2 women were all subsequently charged and bailed to appear at Wirral Magistrates Court on 10<sup>th</sup> September 2010. Yet again information from the public was of great help and we thank those involved.

A 14 year old boy has been arrested and subsequently charged with a burglary in Pensby.

Leanda O'Hare, aged 32, of no fixed address, has been convicted of shoplifting in Heswall and sentenced to 36 months

imprisonment of which 18 months are suspended.

Daryll Hobson aged 28, of Broughton Lane, Salford has been convicted of the theft of a handbag at Thornton Hall, Thornton Hough. He was fined £200 and ordered to pay £100 costs and £24 compensation

Ian Hodkinson, aged 41, of Ambleside Close, Thingwall was convicted of drink driving and disqualified from driving for 2 years.

Paul Davison, aged 31, of Pensby Road was convicted of drink driving and disqualified from driving for 3 years. He was also fined £1000.
